As she narrates, readers get a tender glimpse into a life on the front lines, one filled with love and trauma, fear and hope. A much needed perspective from a Ukrainian author and illustrator.



Her books have been awarded a number of children's literature awards, including acceptance to the White Raven Catalogue and shortlisted for the BBC Children's Book Award. Oksana has a PhD in Education and has taught children's literature at the University of Georgia and served as a children's literature consultant and a creative curator. Oksana lives in Vermont.

Ben Rothery's Weird and Wonderful Animals

Written and Illustrated by Ben Rothery

A stunning visual exploration of what it takes to be counted among the weirdest, most incredible animals on Earth. From the bone-crunching bearded vulture to the venomous platypus, many of the creatures featured here are undeniably weird. But readers of this field guide-like picture book will learn that what makes an axolotl or flying snake so strange, to humans at least, is often exactly what helps it to survive in its habitat. Award-winning illustrator Ben Rothery's fact-filled book of the planet's weirdest, most wonderful creatures explores the scene.

Ben Rothery is a detail-obsessed illustrator from Norwich, England, via Cape Town. He combines multiple processes to create intricate and delicate illustrations and repeating patterns, full of fine detail and vibrant color. Much of Ben's work is inspired or informed by his love of nature—he grew up wanting variously to be a shark, a dinosaur or David Attenborough crossed with Indiana Jones, but settled on illustration as a way to bring those fantasies to life on paper. Ben works from a small studio in London, which he shares with an unnecessarily large collection of very sharp pencils.





Henry Herz (San Diego, CA) writes fantasy and science fiction for children. His stories have been published in *Highlights for Children*, and he is the author or coauthor




An engaging forestfocused guessing game for budding biologists!


